Seventy New Cases Develop, of Which Only 18 Are Diagnosed as Being Spanish Influenza.

CASES AT BENSON IMPROVE

Seventy new cases of influenza, 18 of which are diagnosed as Spanish influenza, were reported by the city health bureau this morning.

To date some 300 cases have been reported by the health officer, Dr. George Farrish, city health officer today. The fact that but one victim of the disease contracted in Portland has died is taken as a favorable indication that the malady has not obtained a firm hold on Portland.
