...at 100 men the situation would be much worse than it is, it was frankly stated.

Practically every large manufacturing and jobbing drug house in New England has abandoned every effort to do its regular business and has concentrated all its efforts and forces upon handling only essential drugs.

Salesmen have been called in off the road and are working as stock men and jobbers in the Boston offices, motor truck trains are coming daily and nightly from New York with essential supplies only, and at a cost five to six times as great as the profit would be, and managers, stock men, office girls and messenger and errand boys are working 15 and 18 hours a day and even on Sundays to get the required supplies to the hospitals, Army and Navy posts, stations, schools and camps and to the retail druggists.

Hundreds of the experienced hands at the big drug and distributing agencies have succumbed to the strain. Yet the well are working in the same manner, in the interests of humanity and from patriotism, pure and simple, it was declared.

**INOCULATING POLICEMEN**

All the members of the Police Department will be inoculated with the anti-influenza serum discovered by Medical Examiner Timothy J. Leary.

A Police Department doctor called at headquarters yesterday afternoon and began the work. Every inspector on duty assembled in Capt. King's office to receive what was termed the "first jab." Three inoculations, doctors say, are necessary.

Today and tomorrow a doctor will be at headquarters to use the needle on those applicants connected with the department and members of the press assigned at headquarters.
