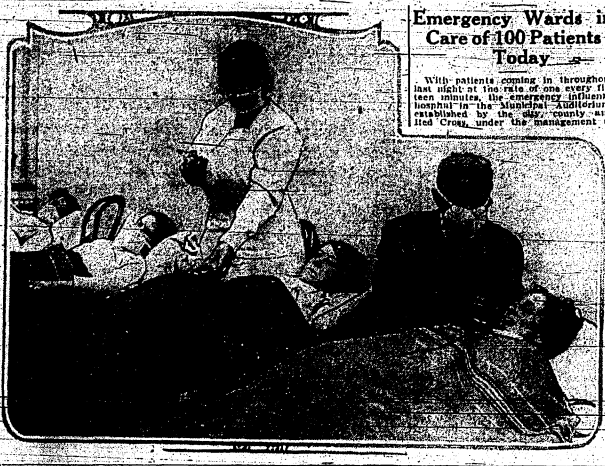

Cafes, restaurants and saloons closed early last night without incident for the first time in record in Oakland. The early closing was the result of lack of business, due to the Spanish influenza epidemic.

Emergency Wards in Care of 100 Patients Today

With patients coming in throughout last night, the rate of one every fifteen minutes was maintained at the flu hospital in the Oakland auditorium today.

PRISONERS STRICKEN

The situation was complicated by the removal of three male prisoners stricken with the disease to the Auditorium Hospital. Dr. Daniel Crosby, the city health officer, asked that the police detail prisoners to watch the prisoners in the hospital, but was told that this could not be done as the police department is stretched to the limit by the result of the illness of a score of its members who are suffering from influenza.

ACCORS STRANDED BECAUSE OF 'FLU'

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 24.—(Special) A number of sailors and mariners stranded in Oakland, San Francisco, Seattle and other coast cities through the closing of the theaters during the influenza epidemic, are in an almost hopeless condition, having been cut off from the outside world for some time.

VACCINE TO GO TO CAMPS FIRST

The Alameda county relief committee today had nearly 50 cases, two deaths and more cases awaiting accommodation. The hospital was closed yesterday. An urgent call was issued to the public this morning for beds, bedding and cooked food. Sixty beds that the hospital had yesterday are filled and more are wanted.

Two of three times a day. No cases of influenza should be given any form of special treatment, but patients may be given a diet of milk soups. A meat broiling area of 1000-1500 calories is recommended. The patient should be given plenty of rest and plenty of fluids. Fruit juices, such as orange, apple, grape, and lemon, are all equally satisfactory.

Breakfast for Convalescents

(1) Oatmeal, cornmeal, cream of barley, wheat, etc., milk or cream. (2) Milk with butter or oleomargarine. (3) Orange, lemon or ripe banana. (4) Milk with fruit in moderate quantities. (5) Egg omelet, soft-boiled egg, or a custard of rolled toast moist with milk, such as a lamb chop, beefsteak, sole, or a cream dish such as creamed cauliflower. (6) Tea or a French custard.

Lunch and Dinner

(1) A vegetable soup. (2) Baked potatoes or creamed macaroni and cheese or rice. (3) Roasted chicken or mutton, with butter or oleomargarine. (4) Tomato, asparagus, lettuce, artichoke salad with oil dressing. (5) An egg omelet, soft-boiled egg, or a custard of rolled toast moist with milk, such as a lamb chop, beefsteak, sole, or a cream dish such as creamed cauliflower. (6) Tea or a French custard.
