## Three Calls Received Here for Limited Service Registrants

Mix call A-1689, calls for the entrainment of 100 white stenographers, typists, clerks, qualified for special or limiting service only, to be sent to Fort Thomas, Ky. The voluntary period for this call ends November 10. The men are to be entrained during the three-day period beginning November 15.

Mix call A-1592, calls for the enlistment of fifty white foresters or lumbermen, qualified for limited or special service only, to be sent to Camp Forest, Lytle, Ga., during the three-day period beginning November 15. The period during which registrants may volunteer for Mix call ends November 20. After that date if the number of volunteers does not fill the calls, involuntary induction will be resorted to.
