Two members of the metropolitan police department died from influenza yesterday.

Private Fred Jefferies of the ninth precinct, one of the victims, lived at 409 1/2 street, N.E. He was thirty-two years old, and had been on the police force for the period of three years. He formerly served in the eighth precinct. He is survived by a wife and two children. All are now ill with influenza.

Private J. W. Conrad, forty-six years old, is the other policeman to succumb. He served for the past twenty years in the eighth precinct and had been on the force for fifteen years.
