# ALL BOSTON REOPENED FOR BUSINESS THIS MORNING

## Places That Were Closed by Health Edicts Are Unusually Crowded

"Open for business."

All business in Boston is booming to-  
day after three weeks' interruption ow-  
ing to fear of spreading the epidemic  
which now is waning.

Public schools reopened this morning  
and thousands of merry, laughing chil-  
dren played fearlessly upon the streets,  
in the parks and the school yards, as  
they went to and from their studies.

All amusement places, soda fountains  
and ice cream parlors opened today and  
were liberally patronized. Promptly at  
6 this morning the saloons opened their  
doors and their patrons were welcomed  
with smiles. Pool and billiard parlors  
and bowling alleys were thronged with  
enthusiasts who have not had a cue or  
a big bowling ball in their hands for  
weeks.

Movie houses never were so crowded  
as they have been today by patrons who  
have been denied a glance at the screens  
for weeks. Street cars, elevated trains  
and steam trains have been thronged  
by the crowds who have come to town  
to celebrate the reopening of the city.

Even with the new food conservation  
rules in force today, the hotels, cafes  
and restaurants have been scenes of  
renewed activity and merriment and  
there appears to be rejoicing in all  
quarters. There have been steady  
streams of shoppers upon the streets,  
and the Common and parks have been  
thronged with people.

Tonight Boston will be brightly illu-  
minated again by the electric signs and  
window displays. The city will be all  
dressed up and there will be many  
places to go with all the theatres open.

While no statistics are at present  
available, it is reported that there is an  
appreciable falling off in the attendance  
at the public schools, perhaps due to  
the fact that some young boys and girls  
have obtained employment to take the  
places of boys and men who have gone  
to war.

Supt Thompson said a thorough med-  
ical examination was being made of  
all the pupils today. The school phy-  
sicians and nurses are on the watch  
for any influenza cases. All pupils of  
working age are asked to give up any  
temporary employment and return to  
their classes.
