Columbia, Sept. 21.—As a precaution against the spread of Spanish influenza, a few cases of which have been reported at Camp Jackson and in a number of States of the Union, Gov. Manning has called on the State board of health to issue an order preventing Ringling Bros. circus from touring the State.

Dr. J. A. Hayne has taken the matter up with the other members of the board and is expected to issue a statement shortly.

Governor Manning stated today that he felt that there was real danger of the circus spreading the disease over the State.
