ALBANY WILL SEND NURSES TO BOSTON

**Seven Leave Today to Assist
in Combatting Influenza
Epidemic.**

RED CROSS GETS APPEAL

**Graduates of Homeopathic Hospital
Expected to Go Tomorrow or
Tuesday.**

In response to an appeal from Boston for nurses to assist in combatting the epidemic of Spanish influenza which has broken out in that city, seven nurses, graduates of the Albany hospital training school, will leave for Boston at 11:30 o'clock today. Despite the shortage of nurses attendance was given last night that few would leave Albany for Boston early this week. The work is in charge of the American Red Cross. Within a few hours after a telegram was received by Miss Anna L. Allen, director of the Red

Cross nursing school in Albany, was received that Albany would supply the appeal. The American Red Cross sent by Miss Mary Deane, director of the nursing branch of the Albany division of the Red Cross, a letter to Boston.

"Boston wants graduate nurses, not necessarily Red Cross nurses. Some have been sent from New York. Send as many as possible from Albany."

Those who will go tomorrow are Miss Catherine York, Miss Anna Flaherty, Miss Veronica Curran, of the Albany hospital staff, and Miss Ellen L. Aker, Miss Mae Dunn, Miss Mary Noonan and Miss Julia Moreland.

Authorities at the Homeopathic and St. Peter's hospitals were notified of the need for nurses in Boston and asked to cooperate with the Red Cross in meeting the emergency. Graduates of the Homeopathic hospital will probably leave tomorrow or Tuesday, although only a few can be sent. At St. Peter's hospital it was said there were not enough nurses to supply the hospital requirement and it would be impossible to send aid to Boston.

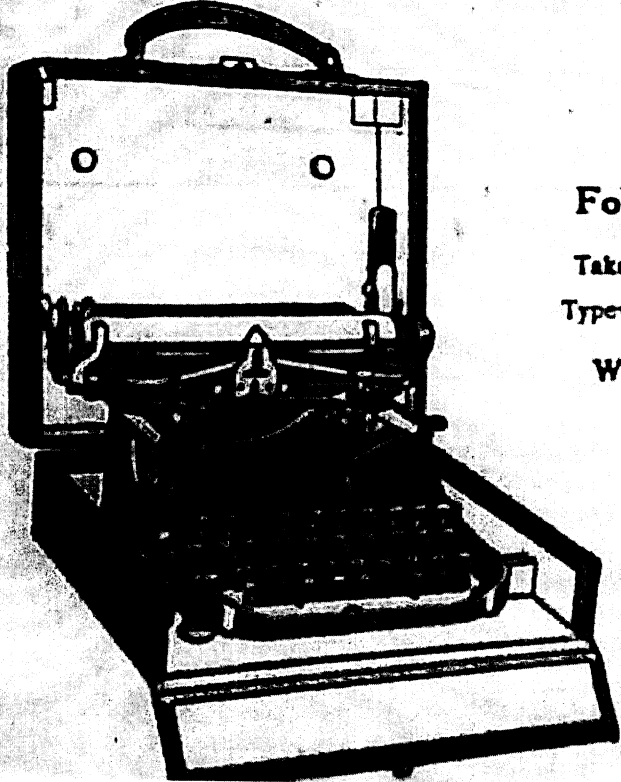
