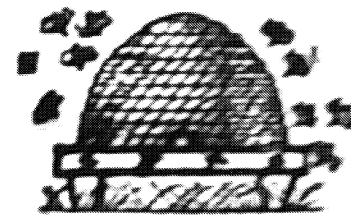
PURITAN SUNDAY DUE TO THE GRIPPE

Auto-less and Church-less, Super-quiet Sabbath

The quietest Sunday Boston ever saw—said the oldtimers as they surveyed the city streets yesterday. Not an automobile moved except Red Cross cars and a few stray taxis. Street cars passed half empty. In spite of the wonderful weather comparatively few people seemed to be out walking. Those who did go out for a stroll had the curiously vague look of people who don't know what to do with themselves.

Which was exactly the trouble in Boston and the suburbs yesterday. With motoring stopped to save gasoline, with all public meetings indoors and outdoors called off and many churches closed because of the influenza epidemic, there was less for the citizens to do probably than on any Sunday since the old Puritan days.

The Catholic churches were open only in the morning and many of the Protestant churches in Greater Boston were closed all day. Even private gatherings at the home of a friend were discouraged by those who heeded the warning notices. All in all it was a bad day for all but the chronic stay-at-homes.
