 The Commission of the City of Birmingham met in the Council Chamber of the City Hall of Birmingham, Friday, October 18, 1918, at ten o'clock, a. m., in adjourned regular meeting.

Present on roll call: President Barrett, Clerk, whereupon the Commission moved its adoption

The following resolution was introduced by Commissioner Hornady:-

WHEREAS, owing to the continued prevalence in the City of Birmingham of a serious epidemic of influenza, a dangerous and highly communicable disease, the Board of Health of Jefferson County, Alabama, and the Health Officer of the City of Birmingham have recommended the continued closing of all places of public assembly in the City for a period of two weeks beginning at midnight on Sunday, October the 20th, 1918.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission of the City of Birmingham as follows:-

Section 1. That all the schools of the city, both public and private, and business colleges, be closed for a period of two weeks beginning at midnight on Sunday, October the 20th, 1918.

Section 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all places of public assembly, including churches, Sunday schools, theatres, moving picture theatres, pool rooms, side shows, street fairs, carnivals, fraternal orders, state fairs, etc., be required to refrain for the same period of time from holding meetings, assemblies, giving exhibitions of any character, or from doing anything which would tend to cause the assembling of people in crowds.

Section 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all auction sales, bargain sales, special sales, or sales of any character which would tend to cause the undue assembling of people in crowds, either in or outside of buildings, be and the same are hereby prohibited for the same period of time.

Section 4. Any person, firm, corporation, organization, association or partnership who violates the provisions of this resolution shall be punished within the limits and as provided by Section 1216 of the Code of Alabama of 1907.

The resolution was read by the City Clerk, whereupon Commissioner Burruss moved its adoption, and upon the roll being called, the vote was as follows:-

The vote was then announced by the City Clerk, whereupon the President declared the resolution adopted.

The following resolution was introduced by Commissioner Hornady:-
