**PRESIDENT ON SHOPPING TRIP**

**Cheered by Crowds as He Walked Up Avenue**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—While President Wilson's decision on Germany's note was being prepared for announcement at the White House and the State Department, the President went down town on a shopping trip. His drive to a jewelry store in the White House motor, but walked back up Pennsylvania avenue to the White House.

Washington has got pretty used to seeing the President in the streets, but his appearance today when the world has its eyes turned toward him sent a thrill of excitement through the city. The President wore a brown business suit, a brown soft hat and carried a walking stick. He was met occasionally by smiling and cheering crowds as he went along carrying a small black bag. A great crowd surrounded the shop in

which the President was and when he appeared he was greeted with shouts of approval. Acknowledging the greetings, Mr. Wilson advanced the motor and strode off up the avenue, waving aloft and with secret service men in the lead and behind.

**PLYMOUTH GAS CO. GRANTED \$2 RATE**

The Board of Gas and Electric Light Commissioners has declined to permit the Plymouth Gas Light Company to put its schedule on a "service-of-cost" basis under which it would be permitted to charge for its gas whatever amount would insure a proper return on the money invested. Instead, it has authorized the company to charge \$2 for the duration of the war, as against \$1.50, the price established last MAY.

The company had asked permission to charge \$1.65 per 100 cubic feet plus such additional increases from time to time as shall equal the actual increase in the cost of making and distribution. The \$1.65 was the price in 1914, so that everything would be figured from that price and time.

**THEATRES WILL OPEN ON MONDAY**

**Influenza Epidemic in Boston Now Near End**

Boston theatres will be allowed to open on Monday. This was decided yesterday afternoon at a conference at the State House of Henry B. Endicott, chairman of the emergency health committee; Dr. Eugene R. Kelley of the State Board of Health, Dr. William C. Woodward, Health Commissioner for the city of Boston, and Captain W. E. Draper of the United States Public Health Service.

**EPIDEMIC ENDED**

The epidemic of Spanish influenza, so far as Boston and its vicinity are concerned, will have almost died out at that time, it is believed, and the health officials at the conference stated that the danger of a spread of the disease will not be increased if the playhouses are allowed to resume performances. The reopening of soda fountains, saloons and other public places of meeting was decided, but the hands of the local health authorities, who will no doubt follow the State's lead and revoke the ban put on those places almost two weeks ago.

Today Commissioner Woodward and Mayor Peters will decide this issue for Boston, and, according to Dr. Woodward's hints, it is an almost foregone conclusion that Boston will be back to normal by Monday. Cities and towns within a radius of 20 miles of Boston have followed the city in every phase of restrictions so far, and it is assumed that they will lift their preventive bans at the same time. It has already been announced that the churches will be allowed to resume services Sunday.

**State Situation Better**

Returns from all parts of the State, except in the densely populated industrial cities, give assurance to the State board that the epidemic is gradually decreasing. From some of the larger cities there were many calls for doctors and nurses, but this deficiency can be met by drafts from other communities where the disease is letting up. Yesterday the State was enabled to release 20 doctors for service in Connecticut, where the malady has been making rapid strides within the last 48 hours.

While the number of deaths reported yesterday in Boston shows a gain of 24, the figures are taken as a decrease by the health officials, who explain that the figures of Sunday were low because of the fact that many of the undertakers did not report their deaths that day, but instead waited until yesterday. Even without this consideration the deaths were a decrease from the figures of Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Yesterday's returns show that 34 persons had died from the influenza and 24 from pneumonia. Today's reports showed 85 deaths from both diseases. The number of new cases is decreasing considerably each day in Boston, and within the next few days the medical men expect to see the daily death rate cut at least 50 per cent.

**CHICOPEE SALOONS ARE OPENED AGAIN**

SPRINGFIELD, Oct. 14.—Two hundred influenza cases and 10 deaths were reported to the local health board in the 48 hours ending this noon. Westfield in 24 hours has had 84 cases, with five deaths. In Chicopee, where there have been comparatively few cases, the authorities today authorized the reopening of saloons, clubs and billiard rooms, but with provisions against crowds. The schools and most of the churches there remain closed.
