**October Food Prices
 Increased Slightly**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19. — Retail
 food prices were 2 per cent higher
 during October than in September, the
 Bureau of Labor Statistics announced
 today.

An increase of 16 per cent was re-
 ported for all articles of food during
 the last year, and a comparison of
 prices for the five-year period from
 October, 1913, to last month showed
 an average increase of 75 per cent.

**Princeton Credits
 Men in War Service**

Princeton University's faculty yes-
 terday ruled that all Princeton under-
 graduates who joined the colors prior
 to June 1913 will be given credit for
 full term's work if they have re-
 ceived commissions.

More than 1,000 Princeton men en-
 tered military and naval service and
 out of them are expected back to
 study for degrees.

**Hotels Again Open
 Their Restaurants**

Hotel managers last night claimed
 a victory over striking waiters and
 kitchen employes. Sherry's, the
 Plaza and Knickerbocker and other
 hotels, it was stated, each had their
 maximum restaurant capacity in oper-
 ation.

Meanwhile, the strikers predicted
 that a general strike of all dining
 room employes in the city, affecting
 more than 250 hotels, will be the out-
 come of a special meeting called for
 Saturday. At this gathering 15,000
 members of the union will vote
 unanimously for a general walk-out,
 it is said.

EPIDEMIC SHOWS INCREASE

Deaths and new cases of influenza and
 pneumonia showed a decided increase
 yesterday. Fifty-six persons died from
 influenza, as compared with 36 the day
 before. There were 189 new cases.
 Pneumonia caused the death of 82, as
 against 88 for the previous day. There
 were 51 new cases.
