## "FLU" CAUSES POSTPONEMENT OF CONVENTION

New York State Bar Association Union Sets Date Forward to Nov. 16 at Fredonia—250 Delegates Going From Rochester

A week from today the ninth annual convention of the New York State Bar Association will be held at Fredonia. The convention, which was originally scheduled to open on Friday, Oct. 11, at the general quarantine regulations existing throughout the state at this time, has been postponed to November 16, 17, 18 and 19. In the event the quarantine regulations have not at that time been generally lifted, the convention will be held in Fredonia on Saturday, December 7, and continued over December 8 and 9. In this rearrangement of dates is witnessed somewhat of the spirit which has made the Bar Association movement during the past 25 years such a power for interesting tens of thousands of young men and women in Bible study and in the work of the Sunday-school and the church. Many conferences and conventions held with the same situation have either dropped entirely their plans or have postponed them indefinitely, but not so with the Bar Association and Philanthropy of New York State. The forthcoming convention will be held as scheduled and with an equally strong program as originally planned, only it will be from two to four weeks later.

It is felt that this will result in a larger number of delegates being present than heretofore, as the weeks intervening will be employed emphasizing the coming convention's importance to every Bible class member, every pastor and every teacher and Sunday-school superintendent throughout the state who is interested in more efficient work among the organized Bible classes. The Sunday evening session will witness, following the addresses of welcome, the delivery of the convention keynote address, "Old Fashioned Patriotism," by Rev. G. A. Axtell, D. D., pastor of the Christian Temple, Wellsville. In this same wide-awake institutional church is located the Holy Bible Class, conducted under the leadership of Paul H. Hanks, who will tell the Bar Association delegates at Monday's conference how his "Holiness" as he calls his men, have made his class hit a long felt need along social lines for the men of Wellsville.

At noon on Sunday the Rev. Arthur Moody, leader of the Mohawk Bible Class of the First M. E. Church of that place, will demonstrate before the winter men's Bible class in the auditorium of the First Presbyterian Church, Fredonia, how a big class of hundreds of men can be of intense interest to every one present. His class in four years has grown to over 400 members. It is expected that the plans for this convention class will bring over 600 men together at the 12 o'clock hour of the convention Sunday. The same evening will carry the big Bar Association idea one step further when the founder of the Mohawk Bible Class, the Rev. Clyde C. Goodrich, now leader of the Malone Bar Association of the Cazenovia M. E. Church, will address the convention on "Building and Maintaining the Bible Class." In two years' time since leaving Mohawk he has built the newer Bar Association in Malone to a membership of over 250 men. Showing such classes in actual operation is the purpose of the big class at noon as taught by the Rev. Mr. Moody. In the evening the Rev. Mr. Goodrich explains the fundamental necessity to obtain in successfully reaching men through such classes.

On the day following during the Monday sessions these two leaders will, in co-operation with the leaders of the state union, present concrete plans for a great state-wide campaign the purpose of which will be to bring thousands of men and women into the Bar Association and Philanthropy classes who now do not attend any Bible class. Since the first notice of the forthcoming convention was given some weeks since the program committee has responded to a call of the Philanthropy and will conduct at noon Sunday in the auditorium of the First Baptist Church, Fredonia, a large class for women. This will be conducted by Miss Mabel H. Trotter of Buffalo, vice-president of the state union, who has conducted successfully for several years a large Philanthropy class in the St. Stephen's Evangelical Church.

The spiritual work of these classes will be strongly emphasized by the address on Sunday evening, "Service in the Front Lines," by the Rev. J. Scott Eberole of Buffalo, pastor of the LaSalle Avenue Baptist Church, and on Monday evening by the address of the Rev. H. Clarke Cofrancesco of Gloversville, on "The Allied Advance."

Jacob Hoert of Buffalo, will tell of the personal work of the Bar Association.

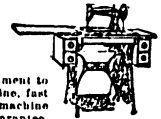
