## ADVISORY BOARD STOPS SESSIONS

Permission Secured From Captain Ziegau—Due to Flu Epidemic.

Sessions of the medical advisory board will be discontinued until the passing of the influenza epidemic. Permission to discontinue the session was secured from Captain Ziegau of Olympia after local physicians had advised him that it was unwise to call registrants together during the epidemic.

The board had been holding regular sessions two nights a week and is now fairly well caught up with its work. Announcement will be made as soon as it is decided to resume the sessions.

## PLANTS SENSITIVE TOWARD LIGHT

Recent experiments have demonstrated the degree of sensitiveness that plants exhibit toward light. Cress seedlings show a distinct curvature after an exposure of only two seconds to a light of 200-candlepower. The feebler the light the longer is the time required to produce a reaction, but in an hour the seedling will curve toward the feeblest glimmer of light.

## Red Flag Displayed by Laborers From Suburbs.

COPENHAGEN, Nov. 1.—A dispatch from Vienna printed in the *Blatt* of Berlin says:

"The national assembly met at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. The vast crowd had assembled before the diet and frantically cheered the red flag which was displayed by laborers from the suburbs of Vienna.

"Socialist members of the diet were cheered when they addressed the crowd in favor of a republic.

"Mayor Weisskirchner tried vainly to get a hearing, but he was greeted with hisses.

"Meanwhile the national assembly had accepted a constitution in which no place was left for the crown. The national assembly has the legislative power while the state council and the state government share the executive power. It was planned to name a new government Wednesday night."
