## HEALTH OF SCHOOL CHILDREN WATCHED

Dr. Chapin Sends Nurses to Investigate Illnesses.

### CONDITIONS CAUSING WORRY

Hundreds of Pupils and About 50 Teachers Reported Sick.—Hope Street High and Rochambeau Avenue Grammar Schools Particularly Hard Hit.

Reports of extensive illness among school children in this city have become so persistent that Superintendent of Health Chapin yesterday morning started an investigation, through the school nurses, in at least three of the city's schools.

Thursday reports were received at the school department at City Hall to the effect that about 100 children at the Rochambeau avenue school were ill, and that a large number at the Niagara street school were also out.

Yesterday morning the school department received word from the Hope high school that of 500 pupils in that school, 104 were at present unable to attend the sessions because of sickness.

The conditions among the school teachers, while somewhat better than Thursday, are still a source of worry.

The department was called upon yesterday morning to furnish 49 substitutes, which it did successfully, except in a single instance. Thursday there were 56 vacancies among the teaching force and only 49 could be filled.
