Dr. Chapin Sends Nurses to Investigate Illnesses.

CONDITIONS CAUSING WORRY

Teachers Reported Sick .-- Hope High and Rochambeau Avenue Grammar Schools Particularly Hard Hit.

Reports of extensive illness among chool children in this city have become so persistent that Superintendent of Health Chapin yesterday morning started an investigation, through the school nurses, in at least three of the city's schools.
