



BIG INCREASE IN FLU FEARED AS RESULT OF PACKED CITY STREETS

Lifting of the Closing Ban Coincident With Peace Celebration Viewed With Apprehension By Health Board.

INFLUENZA SITUATION.

New cases reported the last twenty-four hours—3.
Influenza deaths reported the last twenty-four hours—6.
Pneumonia deaths reported the last twenty-four hours—2.
Total number of cases to date—4,711.
Total number of deaths to date—452.
Total number of new cases shows big decrease over those reported Saturday, but this is due to the fact that practically no reports were made Sunday.
Closing ban lifted in Denver Monday morning. Theaters, pool halls, etc., open. Private and commercial schools open, but public schools remain closed.

With the lifting of the closing ban Monday morning and the gigantic peace demonstration in which a big part of the population of Denver and surrounding towns took part, a big increase in the number of new influenza cases is looked for by the city and state health officials.

"The lifting of the closing ban and the crowds that are on the streets today, will result in an increased number of influenza cases," said one of the city health authorities Monday morning. "There is no use trying to lay down any rules regarding the peace celebration, as the lid is off entirely, and should be on account of the glorious ending of the world's biggest war. But the crowds that are on the streets, in hotels and other

buildings, undoubtedly will result in a big increase in cases of this dreaded disease."

The movies opened their doors Monday morning, after being closed five weeks. Other theaters opened with matinees and good crowds were reported by all. Churches were opened for one hour Sunday morning, with the exception of the Catholic churches, where special half hour services were held. The ban on all indoor and outdoor meetings has been removed, although the health authorities urge that they be limited as far as possible. The public schools will not open this week, the board of education deciding to take no chances of resuming school work before all danger of a further spread of the disease is eliminated.

The situation throughout the state remains unchanged. No detailed reports are being received as to the number of new cases.
